Year 4: Arithmetic, Numbers to 100,000, comparing numbers up to 100,000, rounding to the nearest 10, rounding to the nearest 100.
Year 5: Arithmetic, Numbers to 10 million, place value of digits up to 10 million, comparing numbers within 10 million, rounding to the nearest 1000 and estimating.
Year 6: Arithmetic, Letters in algebraic expressions represent numbers, simplifying algebraic expressions, word problems.
All year groups will carry out ongoing learning of times tables, number facts and mental maths skills. One lesson per week will focus on Problem Solving.
