















### 4. My child has been bullied at school

6. Does your child have SEND (Special Educational Needs or a Disability)?




7. Only answer if you said yes to Q6 above: My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need to succeed






8. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year

### 10. The School has high expectations for my child









11. The school lets me know how my child is doing






### 12. My child does well at this school



13. The school supports my child's wider personal development









### School Response to your suggestions:

We had a workshop from the Children's Society on 16<sup>th</sup> April about keeping children safe from exploitation online and in the 'real world' and we are asking Candice their worker if it is possible to repeat that in another time slot.

Teachers have chosen Jonathan Haidt's book "The Anxious Generation" as their staff development book for this coming year – this looks at how to create a phone-free and play-filled childhood and also tackles what we as school can do to support children who are increasingly facing mental health challenges.

The PTA have sent out an email and WhatsApp messages about asking for help to arrange more events – please respond and we can put more on.

The older children have nature connection sessions every week to be outdoors and gardening and we have planned in blocks of Forest School across KS2 – so older children will get a block, though it will not be weekly as it is lower down the school.

We have one local residential at Pioneer Centre which is cheaper than Arthog – unfortunately coach travel is expensive even for shorter journeys. Arthog does provide a coastal and mountainous environment which not all children are familiar with and we think one local, one further away is a good balance.

We have a lot of trips in and visits out planned this term and every term but we are conscious of the cost of travel which is ever increasing.



We will be doing a menu review at half term. Portions are controlled by School Food Regulations but there are often seconds for KS2. Cheese puff is once a fortnight – so part of the offer across the fortnight and there are two other choices (main and jacket) on a cheese puff day.

Teaching assistants and teachers meet each morning to talk about the day from 8.30-8.40 which is why the playground opens at 8.35 for parents and children to come in and the door opens at 8.40. We have breakfast club available from 7.45am if you need an earlier drop off.

We would love a bike store, new trim trail and more outside equipment – but these will need to be fundraised for as we don't get enough funding for all the things we are doing already – however we are also looking at what grants we can get and are sure we can do more fundraising with PTA – please get involved.

Do contact School Transport at Shropshire Council if you need a bus place – it is great to have children travel on the bus as it saves parking issues which are inevitable – as we are a village school and nearly half of our children have to come from outside of a safe walking distance. Parents are generally very mindful of the service bus getting through and parking considerately for our neighbours. Thank you.

We did football club all year last year, this year children have requested cricket.

We are part of East Shropshire Sports Partnership for sporting fixtures, the very wet weather and impact on waterlogged pitches has caused more issues with cancellations than we can recall before but we do offer team sports and games and will continue to look for more opportunities particularly with Shrewsbury Town Foundation.

If you have any concerns about your individual child, please do come and talk to us. We don't want any child to be reluctant to come to school.
