Ideas to support at home

<p>Communication and Language</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p>
<p>Talk to your child about fantasy worlds such as what superhero they would be, what they think aliens would look like or what spell they would like to cast.</p> 	<p>Can your child join a club or take part in an activity outside or school such as swimming lessons or a gymnastics club?</p>

<p>Can you encourage your child to use a knife and fork? Can your child use scissors for cutting— they will receive a cutting skills booklet and scissors in their take home folder.</p> 	<p>Can you sing rhymes with you child? Which words rhyme? Can you encourage your child to hear the first sound in words? E.g. eye spy</p>

<p>Can you play games at home using dice or dominoes? Can the children say how many dots without counting? Can you spot shapes around the house or outside? Your child will receive numbers and shapes in their take home pack.</p> 	<p>Can you find out about a different country? What is the weather like there? What animals and plants might grow there?</p> 
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p>	<p>SHARING TASK</p>
<p>Can you build a superhero den, a pirate ship, a space rocket, a fairy garden or castle at home?</p> 	<p>This is an activity that can be brought in to school to be shared and celebrated. Please bring in on first day back to school in September. A book that can be used for the holiday diary will be sent home before the summer holidays.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Holiday diary</p> <p>This is a diary for the children to share what they have done with their family over the summer holiday. This can include photos, drawings, leaflets and writing. These can be sent in to school to be kept in our reading area. The children enjoy looking at and sharing these throughout the year. Please be aware that as they are well loved and looked at in school they may get damaged so please keep copies of special photos.</p>
<p>Sticky Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can use scissors correctly and safely to make snips in paper • I can hold a pencil using a 3 friend grip I can use a knife and fork to eat my food • I can listen for 5 minutes to a story or adult I can sing 3 songs from memory • I can use 3 art techniques- dot art, finger/hand painting and stamping • I can remember the mains parts of the story: E.G. The Elves and the Shoe Maker and Room on the Broom.' • I can answer 'why' questions such as 'why' Zag was sad and 'why' the shoe maker was so happy. • I can spot and suggest rhymes • I can count or clap syllables in a word— up to 3 • I can recognise words with the same initial sound, such as money and mother • I can write some letters accurately. • I can link numerals and amounts to 5. • I can compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than'. • I can name and sort circles, triangles, rectangles and squares.
